2024 AFBF Convention Report

Secretary of Agriculture Vilsack Speech to Farm Bureau Members

United State Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack addressed the closing general session at the convention, where he announced more than \$200 million in loans and grants for fertilizer production and renewable energy. He discussed the need for conservation, the threats of farm consolidation, and the loss of farmland and how they tied to the opportunity to farm. Secretary Vilsack spoke of a book he keeps on his desk his son had given him for Christmas titled Conservation by Gifford Pinchot. Pinchot was the first head of the U.S. Forest Service. Vilsack spoke of a quote from Pichot on the importance of conservation - the significance of our natural resource base being fundamental to our democracy, to our way of life, to our economy. It was Pichot's belief that we needed to maintain our natural resource base to be a successful nation. Vilsack said he would add a component to what Pinchot said, "at the foundation of our economy and our value system is American agriculture - the farmers and ranchers and producers across this great country." He went on to say:

There's also the desire and the need for us to conserve that opportunity in the face of challenging economics. Here's what you may not know, in addition to Gifford Pinchot, who expressed concern, on my desk there's also a book that was written in 1863, it was the first report of the Commissioner of Agriculture for the United States. It was a report to Abraham Lincoln. Thankfully I don't have to do that with President Biden. Good Lord, this report was 632 pages long. It was remarkable. But in it was a reference about the importance of preserving the

opportunity for small and mid-size farming operations as centra to our democracy - and a warning - that if we allowed the erosion of small and midsized operations that
